A wise friend of mine once told me that if you walked into a cemetery and saw people rising out of their graves, you'd probably go and tell people. But for some reason when we are in church and look around at everyone whom God has rescued from eternal condemnation to new life in Him, we see this resurrection, but for some reason most Christians don't talk about it.

The reality is, if your life with God really is that life-

changing, then it should be just as natural to want to talk about what He has done for you as it is to talk about the weather. If we really believe that God has done so much to and for us, it's only natural to want to talk about Him with other people.

As we begin this Christmas season, I'd like to challenge you. Pick at least one person that you know who isn't a churchgoer. First and foremost, begin to pray for that person on a daily basis. (*Prayer is one of God's most underused gifts*.) The second half of this challenge is to invite that person to join you at worship. Don't just invite them to come to church, but invite them to come with you and sit with you at worship. Statistics show that eighty percent of first-time visitors to a church come because someone invited them. Maybe some of them were only waiting for an invitation. Maybe it will be the best Christmas gift you ever gave.

Remember my friends, wherever you go, whatever you do, you're on the King's business.

The Advent season begins Dec. 2nd. As we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ, we invite you to join us for our Wednesday evening soup suppers and worship services.



Soup suppers start each Wednesday at <u>6:15 p.m.</u>, followed by a worship service at <u>7:30 p.m</u>. Midweek services will take place on <u>Dec. 5</u>, <u>Dec. 12</u> and <u>Dec. 19</u>.



Our Advent series for traditional worship focuses on the ways in which God is with us through our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Each week will focus on a different word picture of the coming Christ found in the poetic and prophetic words of Isaiah. Services will reveal how Christ continues to be present with us even now. The theme verse for the entire series is: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call His name Immanuel (which means, God with us)" (Matthew 1:23).

- Week 1: Our Potter (Isaiah 64:8): God is with us as our Potter, who shapes according to His will.
- Week 2: Our Shepherd (Isaiah 40:11): God is with us as our Shepherd, who carries us close to His heart.
- Week 3: Our Living Branch (Isaiah 11:1): God is with us as our Living Branch, who died and rose to give us eternal life.


It's never too early to start playing Christmas carols--
